Professor Perry was jointly appointed to the Faculty of Law and the Department of Computer Science, at the University of Western Ontario in 1999, following seven years at the University of Auckland Faculty of Law. Professor Perry's legal research remains focused on the intersection of law and technology, with particular emphasis on Open Innovation, intellectual property rights, software licensing, and the blossoming field of biotechnology law. Being jointly appointed, Professor Perry has to address platforms in both Law and Computer Science, and in the last year prelected audiences from these



disciplines in India, Australia, Brazil and New Zealand. He is a Faculty Fellow of IBM's Center for Advanced Studies in Toronto. In addition to contributing through Technical Program Committees and co-chairing for Iaria and IEEE sponsored conferences, he is also a reviewer for many publications in both computer science and law.
